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Baltics4UA: Supporting Ukraine through citizen engagement at Baltic Universities

Deliverable factsheet

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Abstract:	This document presents evidence from the WP2A1 mapping activity that was conducted by Baltics4UA partners from February to May 2023, on citizen engagement actions by Baltic universities for the benefit of Ukrainian displaced persons and refugees.
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Short description

Work package 2 activity 1 (WP2A1) aimed to identify and analyse social actions developed and completed by universities in the Baltics in response to the ongoing Ukrainian humanitarian crisis. It included a mapping activity that resulted in a curated showcase and analysis of 20 citizen engagement initiatives coordinated by Baltic universities to address the Ukrainian humanitarian crisis (D1).
