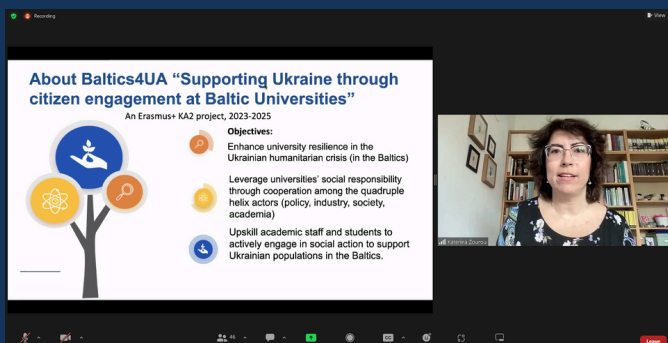

## Baltics4UA World Cafés!

Baltics4UA university partners organized four in-person world cafes in Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, and Ukraine. The discussion format allowed participants to address universities' responses to the crisis caused by the full-scale war in Ukraine, resulting in a total of 125 participants.



## Web2Learn's Webinar on the Crisis in the Baltic Region caused by Russia's war on Ukraine

Web2Learn hosted a webinar on the role of businesses and academia in fostering resilience in response to the crisis caused by Russia's war on Ukraine in the Baltic region. The session brought together 51 participants from various sectors, including business, academia, and policy-making.



## 23 citizen engagement actions!

The consortium organized 23 citizen engagement actions using a variety of formats in line with the project's methodology. These events included public lectures, movie screenings, meetings with the Ukrainian ambassador, and many others.

## Workshops for academic staff

Baltics4UA provided trainings for academic staff to foster citizen engagement skills based on the policy brief and practical template for events organization produced by UT.
